

WHMIS for Saskatchewan Workers

WorkSafe Saskatchewan, in association with the Canadian Centre for Occupational Health and Safety (CCOHS), has developed an online course that focuses on the general aspects of WHMIS training – WHMIS labels, Safety Data Sheets (SDS) and symbols, which provide workers with hazard information on products they use in the workplace. While this hazard information is important, it can only reduce injuries and illness when workers understand and use the material. For this reason, regulations require employers to implement a site-specific WHMIS worker training program.

This course is for anyone who works with or could be exposed to hazardous materials at work.

What are employers required to do?

After completing the online course, you must get additional site-specific training for the chemicals and materials you work with or could be exposed to, and the appropriate safety measures for your workplace. Your employer is responsible for arranging this portion of your training.

Incident Investigations in Saskatchewan Workplaces

Participating in incident investigations is an important role of the occupational health committee and the health and safety representative. This course provides an introduction and practical approach to conducting incident investigations. It will also explain regulatory requirements and how to use investigation results to make workplace improvements.

This course is for anyone who may be called upon to do an incident investigation, including managers, supervisors, safety personnel, occupational health committees and occupational health and safety representatives.

Course outline

- Understanding the regulatory requirements for investigating workplace incidents and dangerous occurrences.
- Collecting evidence in a workplace incident investigation.
- Analyzing evidence in a workplace incident investigation.
- Developing a report from a workplace incident investigation.
- Making improvements following a workplace incident investigation.

What are employers required to do?

After completing the online course, you must get additional training about the workplace investigation process for your workplace. Your employer is responsible for arranging this portion of your training.

Saskatchewan Workplace Inspections

Inspections are essential to making workplace health and safety systems effective. This course explains how to prepare for and conduct workplace inspections. It also explains regulatory requirements and how to use inspection results to make improvements.

This course is for anyone whose duties involve workplace inspections, including managers, supervisors, safety personnel, occupational health committees and occupational health and safety representatives.

Course outline

- Understanding the purpose of workplace inspections and the regulatory requirements.
- Planning workplace inspections.
- Conducting workplace inspections.
- Using the results of workplace inspections to improve health and safety.
- Reviewing and revising a workplace inspection system.

What are employers required to do?

After completing the online course, you must get additional training about the workplace inspection process for your workplace. Your employer is responsible for arranging this portion of your training.

Registration

*Training recognition

Taking the **Inspection** and **Incident Investigation** courses is considered “training by an approved agency” for the purposes of section 46(4) of *The Occupational Health and Safety Regulations, 1996*.

Completing both of these courses is equivalent to completing the 2-day Occupational Health Committee Level II training offered by WorkSafe Saskatchewan.
